NBSW and INNER CITY SOCIAL WORK PROGRAMS

The University of Manitoba Faculty of Social Work invites applications for two probationary Assistant Professor positions, beginning July 1, 2010, or as soon as possible thereafter. One position will be with the Northern Social Work Program in Thompson, MB (Position # 10710) and one with the Inner City Social Work Program (Position #10709) located in Winnipeg's North End. Both programs are University of Manitoba off-campus ACCESS programs designed to enhance accessibility of the BSW program to mature students who face significant social, academic and financial barriers to post-secondary education, including for example Aboriginal peoples, newcomers to Canada and people living in poverty.

The Faculty of Social Work is proud of its continued efforts to broaden accessibility to social work education that addresses poverty, family violence, racism, sexism, homophobia, ableism, ageism and other forms and sources of oppression. The Faculty offers three degree programs. The BSW provides a generalist foundation with an emphasis on feminist and Aboriginal peoples' policy and practice, while offering the opportunity for focused study in a variety of practice areas. The MSW includes specializations in social clinical practice and social services administration. The Ph.D. Program includes a research and theory core, along with opportunities for individualized study. We are one of the largest social work programs in Canada, with three sites, practice training and research facilities, and a distance delivery program. Candidates for these positions should have the ability to contribute to all programs through teaching, research, and graduate student supervision. Aboriginal peoples, northern/rural practice, child welfare, Canadian social welfare policy, gerontology, disability, mental health, and newcomers are especially desirable areas of practice or policy expertise.

A Social Work degree is required. A successful candidate who holds a Ph.D. in Social Work or a cognate discipline will be appointed to a tenure-track position at the rank of Assistant Professor. A successful candidate who is near completion of Ph.D. will be appointed to a term position at the rank of Lecturer, until completion of the Ph.D. and must successfully complete the Ph.D. within the mutually accepted term period. Salary will be commensurate with experience and qualifications although this is an entry level position.

The University of Manitoba encourages applications from qualified women and men, including members of visible minorities, Aboriginal peoples and persons with disabilities. All qualified candidates are encouraged to apply, however, Canadians and permanent residents will be given priority.

Application materials, including letters of reference, will be handled in accordance with the protection of privacy provisions of "*The Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy*" (Manitoba). Please note that curriculum vitae may be provided to participating members of the search process.
